Biographical Sketch/ Administrative History: Wayne Scott Ray (1950-), poet, was born in Alabama, United States and grew up in Stephenville, Newfoundland and Woodstock, Ontario. He is the founder of HMS Press, a book distribution company. He has served as secretary/treasurer of the Canadian Poetry Association (1985-1988) and was a co-chairman of the League of Canadian Poets. He served as the curator of the Field horticultural photographic collection. In 1988 he established the London chapter of the Canadian Poetry Association and in the following year he was recipient of the Editors' Prize, 'Canadian author and bookman', for best poet published in 1989.

Scope and Content: The fonds consists of records relating to the Canadian Poetry Association, League of Canadian Poets and the HMS Press, as well as personal papers and manuscripts of Wayne Scott Ray.

INTRODUCTION

BIOGRAPHY

Wayne (Scott) Ray was born in Alabama in 1950 and lived with his family on the Ernest Harmon Air Force Base, Stephenville, Newfoundland until his mid teens. He moved to Woodstock, Ontario in 1965, to Toronto, with his wife and children, in 1973 and to London, Ontario in July 1988.

Ray is both a poet and a publisher. He has had published eleven collections of poetry and has had individual poems published in anthologies. He founded the HMS Press, a publishing and book distribution company and the Multicultural Poetry Reading Series. In addition, he was co-founder and secretary/treasurer of the Canadian Poetry Association (CPA), co-chairman of the League of Canadian Poets: Associates (1985-1986), co-director of the Beaches Library Poetry Workshop (1983) and curator of the Field Horticultural Photographic Collection.

ORGANIZATION

The papers arrived in three cubic foot boxes. They had been sorted, grouped and labelled by the donor. They were transferred to acid-free file folders very much in the order in which received and the information on the labels was copied onto the folders. There was some minimal sorting where it seemed preferable to the content of the material and some of the groupings were too large and had to be subdivided. The labels were adjusted accordingly. The collection was transferred to seven acid-free boxes.

The material logically fell into seven series: series I contains manuscripts, typescripts, etc. and was subdivided into those by Ray and those by others; series II contains diaries and journals, again subdivided into those by Ray and by others.; series III is a small financial section; series IV contains correspondence and papers, mostly with family members; series V holds the papers related to the Canadian Poetry Association; series VI those related to the HMS Press and series VII has other miscellaneous material.

There is some overlapping: papers relating to the CPA and the HMS Press can appear in either section; the correspondence

contains newspaper clippings and several files contain photographs. The material in Series I.D. could have been placed as easily in Series VII. However, whenever there was any doubt, it was felt preferable to leave the material in the order in which it had been received.

His diary for 1987 (File 31) has been RESTRICTED, with the request that the sealed envelope in which it was received be unopened. File 121, containing material related to the Ontario Provincial Police (O.P.P.) is also RESTRICTED. In addition, Ray has requested that anyone wanting to see the papers should speak to him first.
